## Karya Vibhag Vrutta

### Shareerik

To increase the physical strength and to boost immunity of Swayamsevaks almost all the Prants conducted online competitions of Niyudh (Martial Art), Yogasan and Dand. Nearly 500 games were newly designed which can be played in E-Shakha or within a family.

Some Prants conducted an online training of the syllabus of Sangha Shiksha Varg.

Many Prants conducted training programs for imparting training in playing of Ghosh instruments. An All India online training camp was organised to impart the skill of playing instruments like Clarinet & Trumpet. 124 Swayamsevaks participated.

This year in the annual Prahar Yadnya 4,53,233 Swayamsevaks participated ( 56794 more than the previous year ) and completed 22,02,37,218 Prahar.

### Baudhik

- 1) Programs like Baudhik Varg, Sangh Parichay Varg, Akhand Bharat Smriti Diwas, Book Reading were arranged. 10,36,394 participated in 24,077 such programs.
- 2) 54,455 attended in 1,949 training programs organized in the country which included workshops, group discussion etc.
- 3) 700 competitive events were organized in the country in which 1,79,660 contestants participated. Events included Elocution competition, Quiz, Biography reading, Singing of patriotic songs etc.
- 4) Arrangement of workshops at Vibhag and Jilla level on topics such as Map of our Country, Prarthana recitation, Patriotic song recitation, technique of storytelling and News Analysis,

have improved the implementation of these subjects at Shakha level.

### Sewa

8,277 Shakhas in Urban areas have appointed a Sewa Karyakarta. 8,599 Sewa Bastis have been selected by as many Shakhas to look after its overall development.

Sewa Gatha, a magazine which was started 3 years ago, is now available in 4 languages. Hindi, Marathi, Kannada and English. Apart from this the contents are available in Telugu on Social Media.

Total regular Sewa Karya run by Shakhas and Sewa Bharati is 40,096.

Sewa week was observed by 11 Prants. Apart from this 31,237 Sewa activities were carried out by 11,914 Shakhas.

Post Covid health camps were organised in Chennai, Bengaluru, Gorakhpur, Pune and other cities. Tuition classes for children were also arranged.

### Sampark

Invited guests from the various fields including Education, Defence, Bureaucracy, and those in the Sewa sector participated in 120 seminars conducted online.

On organisational level 41 Prants conducted training programs. Training programs and meetings were conducted by regional teams for Prant level Karyakartas.

### Special Programs.

- 1) On 29th November 2020 an online Lecture was delivered by Pujaniya Sarsanghachalak ji on the topic 'India's role in World Scenario'. 640 distinguished invitees from all over the country participated along with 365 Sangh Adhikaries.

- 2) An online program involving people working in the field of Education, Health, Employment, those working for people with special needs and Women representatives of 266 organisations working in the field of Sewa for Women was addressed by Mananiya Sarkaryawah ji. Challenges and solutions while working were discussed and the need to carry on activities in a coordinated manner was stressed upon.
- 3) Mananiya Sarkaryawah ji also addressed representatives of 219 NGO's who work at Local as well as International level on 15th January 2021.
- 4) A training camp was conducted on 7th February 2021 for those who are in charge of contacting high level dignitaries across the country.

### Prachar

The following programs were arranged by Prachar Vibhag in presence of Pujaniya Sarsanghachalak ji.

- 1) 52 Editors of reputed dailies and anchors of news channels attended a meeting on 8th Dec 2020 at Delhi.
- 2) In Mumbai on 25th Dec 2020 18 editors of leading newspapers and 13 producers of television serials participated in a meeting.
- 3) Persons influential on social media were invited for a conclave on 22nd & 23rd February in Delhi. 85 persons including 14 women participated.

## Gatividhi

### Gram Vikas

**Uday - Prabhat Gram** – Presently 340 Prabhat level villages and 1,360 Uday level villages along with 2,000 other villages are engaged in Cow based traditional organic farming. Social transformation is seen in villages as social amity, common water source, common funeral site for every one, and same Mandir for everyone is practiced.

7,000 people participated in a 3 day Skill Development Program in Karnataka Dakshin Prant.

Home Kitchen and Yog Centers are run in over 700 villages.

**Gram Sankul** – Coordinated efforts are carried out in clusters involving adjoining villages. Such efforts are being carried out in around 1,000 villages involving Sagod Khand of Chittod Prant, Rupa Khedi Khand of Malva Prant, Puttur district of Karnataka Dakshin Prant, and Adilabad district of Telangana Prant.

**Farmer Produce Organisation** (Farmer to Consumer Direct Sale) have been formed and run successfully in Telangana, Malva, Gujarat, Pashchim Maharashtra, and Vidarbha.

**Organic farming** is also successfully carried out on the scale ranging from 100 to 1000 acres in Chittod, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Malva, Gujarat, Saurashtra, and Karnataka Dakshin.

Various programs are being carried out at Khand and district level all over the country. Malva, Gujarat, Chittod, Karnatak Dakshin have gone a step further by spreading this work to majority of its villages.

### Go Sewa

Last year, 589 varga were held in 26 prant. 14,847 trainees attended it. 5,618 programs were held at 4,572 places on the occasion of Gopashtami. There are 5,617 centers generating energy through Cowdung and Cow based medicine centers run at

45,590 places. During Ganesh Utsav 8,32,969 Ganpati Murtis, and 5,28,45,946 Deepak (Lamps) during Deepawali were made from Cow dung. There were 42,562 participants in the Go Vigyan examination conducted in 7 Prantas.

Karyakarta meetings were held in 310 Vibhags of the country. 12,737 Karyakartas participated.

### Kutumba Prabodhan

- 1) Padmashree Ms. Nivedita Didi, Vice President of Vivekananda Kendra, Kanyakumari, elaborated on the subject of "Yama-Niyam" in a symposium organized to celebrate "International Yoga Day" on 21 June 2020. 65,000 families participated.
- 2) On 01-01-2021 Karyakartas of district and above level Kutumba Prabodhan were addressed by Shri Suresh Soni ji on the topic "Param Vaibhav through Panchayadnya". Over 7,500 families attended.
- 3) Last year, two meetings of all the Pranta convenors at Akhil Bhartiya level were organised online.

### Programs undertaken at the State and District level

- A) In all the States, Under the "Kshema-Kushal" week / fortnight every worker talked to at least 10 families by making a call on mobiles. The informal conversation benefitted large numbers families.
- B) In various States, new games were successfully played within the house amongst family members. This helped in their Personality Development. Devgiri, Gujarat, Saurashtra and Malwa Prant were on the forefront.



- C) Under the program "One Evening - Family Evening" 5 "P's" Pooja / Prayer, Pranayam, Parichay of Sangh, Prerak Prasang and Prasad were discussed within the family in Haryana Prant on 24 October 2020. A similar program was also held in Karnataka Uttar Prant. 42,007 members from a total of 9,817 families participated.
- D) In Vidarbha province, the month of Shraavan was earmarked to celebrate 'Sankalp Month' by families. Family members were encouraged to take a small pledge of social importance and implement it.
- E) Young Married couples were counselled on the topic "Supraja" for a healthy society in Karnataka Dakshin, Karnataka Uttar, Gujarat, and Kashi Prant.

### Samajik Samarasata

- 1) A webinar/virtual discussion on "Black Lives Matter : Indian Perspective" was held, wherein 72 Professors/Vice Chancellors participated. Discussions were later published in form of an E-Book and on that occasion intellectuals from India and other countries participated in a panel discussion on the topic 'Caste and Race'.
- 2) A special study on 'Migrant Labourers' was conducted.
- 3) 29 articles, 8 videos and 4 audios were prepared on 18 scholars who have significantly contributed

towards Samajik Samarasata. These were extensively used by the volunteers of Samajik Samarasata and the media personell.

- 4) 7 special virtual meetings were organized on different themes in groups which included leaders of Scheduled Caste Communities, Researchers on Migrant Labourers and Young Professors & Thinkers.
- 5) Public leaders and important personalities were contacted to apprise them about the social work done during the Corona pandemic.
- 6) One book each in Telugu on Indian Constitution and Guru Nanak Dev ji were published.

### Paryavaran Saurakshan

**V. C. Conclave** - 81 VC's of Universities across the country participated in an online Seminar. It was viewed by 15,000 people.

**Polythene Free Kumbh** - A movement to replace polythene with cloth bags and to make up Eco Bricks is going on with a target to reach 5 Lakh families.

**Other Programs** - In Rajasthan 5 Lakh trees were planted, Rain Water Harvesting project was carried out at 300 centers and 50,000 nests and water cups for birds were built. Grass for animals was grown in 15,000 acres of land in Jodhpur Prant. 100 Kitchen Gardens were also developed.

**'Gange Cha Yamune'** an Environment Protection awareness rally was organised In Meerut Prant. It travelled for 867.5 KMS spanning 300 villages.

## Prant - wise Special Programs

### Kerala

**Bal Swayamsevak Program** - P. T. demonstrations and Route Marches were held at 1107 circle centers. 22,335 Swayamsevaks participated in Sanchalan while 17,135 in P. T. demonstrations, 12,454 in Yogasan, 6,411 in Martial Arts and 3,230 in Padavinyas. Other than these 39,000 Swayamsevaks were present at the programs. This resulted in an increase of Vidyarthi Shakhas and the average attendance at Shakhas went up.

### Uttar Tamilnadu

Pu. Sarsanghachalak ji visited Ponniamman Medu Vasti of Chennai Mahanagar which is predominantly a daily wage earners Vasti. 170 Swayamsevaks, Prominent people including women were present at the Sankranti Program representing all the 48 lanes of the Vasti.

### Karnatak Dakshin

On Sunday, 27-12-2020, "Swar-Samarpan" annual Ghosh (Band) Programme was organised at Hosahalli village of Shimoga district wherein a 60 minute Ghosh recitation was presented by Matturu Ghosh Kendra. 33 Vadaks participated in the age group from 11 to 53. As preparation for this programme the Swayamsevaks learnt 22 new advanced compositions. This was preceded by almost 100 hours of collective rehearsals.

### Karnataka Uttar

An extensive Sampark Abhiyan was carried out in Bellari Nagar. Bharat Mata Pujan programs and Sangh Parichay Vargas were conducted. 370 Men and 131 women participated in 11 Vargas. There are 29 Shakhas and 2 Saptahik Milan now. A Baudhik Varg on the occasion of Ma. Sarkaryawaha ji's visit was arranged for Swayamsevaks who have attended Shakha for at

least 4 days. 1,283 Swayamsevaks were present representing 27 Vastis and all Shakhas and Saptahik Milans.

### 07. Andhra Pradesh

**1. Gat Vyavastha** - An effort to make an extensive Gat Vyavastha (Group contact System) of all Swayamsekas in the Prant was made prior to the 'Prarthana Divas' Program conducted at All India Level on 19th April 2020. 46,230 Swayamsevaks were grouped in 5,125 groups. The Gat System has a Gat Nayak for each group, 625 Gat Pramukh and 31 Jilla Pramukh. A mobile App named 'Shrushti' has been developed to permanently make use of this system.

**2. Khand Pravass** - Prant Level Adhikaries visited all the 207 Khand of the Prant in between 1st to 15th November to ensure appointment of all Mandal Pramukhs. In the Baithaks during the visit 975 Khand level and 3,619 Mandal level Karyakaratas participated. A total of 5,625 Karyakartas participated. 2000 new Karyakartas were entrusted with responsibilities at Mandal level.

### Konkan

**1) Pujaniya Sarsanghachalak ji's Pravass, Goa - Meeting with Eminent Citizens** - 33 eminent citizens of Goa including Industrialists, Businessmen, Govt. Officials participated in an interface meeting. **Mandir Pramukh Meeting** - Selected Mandir chiefs spanning all sections of the society were invited for a meeting. 37 chiefs from 31 Mandirs attended.

**Karyakarta Baithak & Baudhik Varg** - A meeting with Mandal Pramukhs, Basti Pramukhs, Saptahik Milan Pramukhs and those with higher responsibility was arranged. The attendance was 81%.

2) **Vistarak** - 10 Swayamsevaks dedicated their time as E-Vistaraks (Full Timers) and 21 Swayamsevaks actually went out in different areas.

3) **Study Group** - A study group of interested Swayamsevaks was started in Navi Mumbai. Topics were selected and each one was encouraged to deliver 1 lecture. Every month a lecture followed by discussion on a selected topic was delivered. A library was also developed as a reference source. E-Books as well as books have been distributed. The group consists of 42 Swayamsevaks.

4) **'Maa Bharati Aradhana' Song competition** - This program continued for two and half months in Navi Mumbai every Saturday and Sunday. 10 Nagars participated. Songs were submitted by 141 participants, and 198 Sangh Geets were sung online and votes were given by panelists as well as viewers.

5) 16 speakers participated in a weekly Lecture series in Dindoshi area.

6) **Organic Farming** - Seeds and Cow Manure was distributed amongst farmers of some remote areas of Palghar Dist and they were encouraged to take crops using organic techniques. 200 farmers enthusiastically participated and were highly successful.

7) **Survey for measuring loss of learning skills** - A survey of 200 5th & 6th class students was done in 5 districts of Navi Mumbai. As schools were closed due to Covid-19, the students lost personal contact with teachers and were also deprived of

having an interaction with their fellow school friends. This resulted in loss of their learning capacity. As this would impair their growth a Webinar was arranged to apprise teachers of the situation in which 700 teachers participated.

### **Paschim Maharashtra**

1) **Sangathan Shreni Karyakram** - A training program to train Karyakartas for conducting E-Shakah was held. 746 Karyakartas were trained from 17 districts and 55 E-Vistaraks conducted E-Shakhas.

Slogans having social significance were posted by Bal Shakhas on social media, quiz contests on various topics, other various competitions were held and Swayamsevaks were encouraged to have ground level experience as a measure of developing their personality. Baudhik Varg (Lecture), Classes for singing patriotic songs, speaker training classes, Workshops, Distribution of monthly Shakha magazines etc. were undertaken regularly by the Baudhik team.

Akhand Bharat Sankalp Diwas program was held at 67 places in 24 districts.

Shareerik Vibhag developed 300 games which can be played at the E-Shakha and 1700 Karyakartas were trained through online training classes. An e-booklet for Samata (Mass Drill) was prepared and made available on social media.

2) **Covid Prevention** - In order to prevent the spread of Corona infection, Karyakartas in coordination with local administration, police department, medical teams and various voluntary social organizations, Identified Corona suspected personnel, provided them with isolation facility, conducted medical examination, and provided them with medical treatment and counselling facilities through Covid Care Centers. Volunteers from the age group of 20 to 45 were serving instinctively to provide these facilities. Karyakarta was expected to stay outside his

house for 8 days continuously. Sangh volunteers, Doctors and support staff worked selflessly to prevent the spread of Corona infections from 36,000 infected homes with a sense of fraternity. 1,16,000 persons benefitted from the scheme. In total, with the assistance of 1,016 volunteers and 365 doctors, more than 5,000 persons from 168 hotspots having symptoms were sent for investigation.

- 1) **Covid Center - Pune** - Under the scheme of 'Samarth Bharat Punarbandhani', Covid Centers were run in the hostel of Garware College, Pune. A total of 85 rooms were used to provide 237 beds. 1,600 patients were successfully treated from Corona and returned to their homes. 152 youths and 55 girls served with dedication. In a week 20 volunteers worked in three shifts. They underwent self isolation for 7 days and were then tested for Covid and if found negative would go back home. It was a 'very closely organized' program with minutest details. At the time of admission itself, every patient was given his medicines, items of daily use, etc. Even toys were arranged for children. The team of Sahyadri Rugnalaya and Pune Municipal Corporation extended excellent support.

### Gujarat

During Covid Lockdown 5,632 Swayamsevaks in coordination of Bharatiya Kisan Sangh collected 8,06,217 Kg of wheat and other grains from 1,421 villages of 127 Tahsils. In many villages over 2000 Kg was collected within an hour. 5 Kg wheat flour packets were distributed to the needy.

### Saurashtra

- 1) **Travel of Pujaniya Sarsanghachalak ji** - During this visit, Baithaks for Bastis & Mandal were held to plan expansion of work. 446 Karyakartas out of 492 were present. Issue of spreading Sangh Karya amongst labourers in urban areas and amongst farmers in rural areas was discussed. During this Corona pandemic

families which had been newly contacted were guided towards our work which resulted in speedy augmentation of Sangh Karya.

- 2) **Get-together of family members of Pracharaks and Vistaraks** - An interface programme between Pujaniya Sarsanghachalak ji with 19 families of Pracharak-Vistaraks of the region was arranged. It was attended by about 130 family members.

### Vidarbha

- 1) 'Sushantam' a new composition was played by the Ghosh team at the Vijayadashami Utsav of Nagpur Mahanagar. 2) 40 Vadaks and 3 Trainers participated in an online Ghosh Varg from 14th May to 14th June 2020 in Umred district. 3) An online camp for Bal Swayamsevaks was arranged in Amravati district from 18th to 26th April 2020. 120 Bal Swayamsevaks from 2 Nagar and 7 Tahasil participated. Pariwar Prarthana was also success fully implemented



**Vadya Pujan**

- 4) An online program 'Vadya Pujan' – Puja of Musical instruments was held on 30th June 2020 in Amravati Vibhag. 82 Ghosh Vadaks from 15 Ghosh Kendra were present. This helped in improving perfection while playing the instruments and new Ghosh centers were also started.

**Malwa**

- 1) **“Akhand Bharat Sankalp Din-2020”** : was observed between 1st August to 15 August in online mode. For this purpose teams of about 350 college-students were constituted in 28 districts. Total 1,29,830 students were distributed study material. 12,141 students participated in an online quiz competition. 42,828 volunteers participated in online Bouddhik Vargas. 57 participants were trained in the 'Oratory Training Workshop'.
- 2) **“Seminars of Students”** : Online Seminar sessions with students of various reputed educational institutions were held to discuss - Educational contents and teaching methodology adopted in the reputed educational institutions, contribution of graduates from these institutions towards nation-building, measures to stop anti-national activities carried out in some high-ranking educational institutions, etc. These discussion sessions were held in 7 districts of the Prant 172 students from 72 top educational institutions participated, of which maximum students had come into association of Sangh for the first time.
- 3) **'Sewa Anubhuti' week by college unit** The team overseeing college students organized "Sewa Anubhuti Pakhwara" from 25 December 2020 to 12 January 2021. 1313 students participated in 105 types of Seva Karya from 47 cities in 22 districts of the Prant. On the occasion of "National Youth Day" on 12 January 2021, 25 programs of Anubhav Kathan (experience sharing) were organised by 102 students in which a total of 918 Swayamsevaks participated.

**Madhya Bharat**

- 1) A survey of 3,053 labourers was conducted. Educational facilities through Balgokulam were arranged for Children. 19,709 children from 886 places benefitted due to Balgokulam. 15,072 volunteers were active in different activities at 2,044 places.

- 2) A 10-day (5-14 Oct) virtual varga of expected Swayamsevaks in the Sangh Shiksha Varga was held. Syllabus was taught and various competitions were also organized. 506 Swayamsevaks from 309 places of 128 Khanda / Nagar participated in 8 Vargas for Pratham Varsh. 241 Swayamsevaks from 172 places of 98 Khanda participated in the Dwitiya Varsh Varg.

Virtual Vargas & meetings of Prant and Vibhag Shareerik team were held. 177 Swayamsevaks from 25 districts and 620 Swayamsevaks from 78 Khandas were involved.

Apart from this, Vargas were also held to teach recitation of Prarthana and Ekatamata Stotra at district level.

**Mahakoshal**

1. **E-Varg** : In 31 districts, E-Vargs were organised for those on the expected list of Sangh Shiksha Varg. E-Varg for Pratham Varsh Karyakartas was held at the district level, in which 839 Karyakartas participated. Dwitiya Varsh E-Varg was held at Vibhag level and Tritiya Varsh E-Varg at Prant level.
2. **Qualitative Sanchalan** : Sanchalan was held in 26 districts of the Prant through selection trials at block & district levels and by strictly following Covid-19 safety directives. 2718 Swayamsevaks from 664 shakhas took part in the Sanchalan. Sanchalan in 4 districts was conducted on the rythem of marching songs while Ghosh (Band) was played in 22 districts.

**Chhattisgarh**

- 1) **Ghosh Vibhag A)** On 1st November 2020, Ghosh Varshikotsav was held in Bilaspur. Renowned Sarangi player Shri Rakesh Sarwani was the chief Guest. 40 compositions were played continuously for about 70 minutes by 36 players. **B)** On January 17, 2021, Ghosh's Varshikotsav was also celebrated in Raipur. 29 Vadaks from 5 Nagar played 29 compositions continuously for about 40 minutes.

## 2) Mahavidyalayin Karya

- A) 3784 college students participated in the "General Knowledge Competition" organized at the province level.
- B) On 26-27-28 June 2020, 153 students attended an E Shibir held in Raipur.
- C) 260 Professors participated in a Shibir held on 5-6-7 June 2020.
- D) 84 Medical students participated in an online Shibir on 6-7-8 August 2020.

## Chittod

- 1) **Dakshata Varga** - In view of the Corona pandemic it was not possible to organise regular Prathamik Varg for the Swayamsevaks. Therefore it was decided to hold a one day Varg for selected Swayamsevaks. 208 vargas were organised on 3rd January 2021, wherein 1226 Shakhas and 208 Milan from 1018 places represented and a total 5,959 Swayamsevaks participated.
- 2) **Appa Dipo Bhav** - E-Shibir for college students was held from 1st May (5 am) to 2nd May (5 pm). Swayamsevaks were expected to follow all the rules and daily routine of the Shibir at their respective residence. The day began at 5 am with the Ekatmata Stotra followed by Shakha of 1 hour. Daily activities included chores like cleaning the house and other household work. Swayamsevaks discussed with their family members some topics like, Ideal Hindu Household, Swadeshi and Sewa work of RSS. Two E-books were given for reading as homework. Total 5654 swayamsevaks participated from 1,287 places.
- 3) **Gram Suraksha Samiti** - This Samiti was constituted in 5351 villages. The Samiti ensured that no person in the village remained hungry, besides remaining safe and healthy. It worked

with the cooperation of local administration and health department. Vigilance was maintained round the clock to prevent entry of an unwanted person into the vilage. Decoction (Kadha) was distributed in families as a preventive measure. The committee also took care of the birds by erecting proper nests on trees in villages. Volunteers of the committee marked round circles on the roads to ensure social distancing.

- 4) **E-Vistarak Plan** - 3,643 youth from the Prant dedicated their time as E-Vistarak between 13th August to 13th September 2020, while in some villages Vistaraks visited in person. Various activities were organised in these Shakhas which included making of Seed-Balls and tuition classes. It is worth noting that writing history of Sangha in their village is complete in more than 564 Shakhas.

As per regular annual practice of part-time Vistarak scheme, this year 6806 youths dedicated their time as Vistaraks from 2,251 Shakhas of 1,791 places.

## Delhi

'Anubhuti - 2020' : During 7 to 14 November 2020, an elaborate programme was planned to contact maximum people from every household of all Seva-

Bastis of Delhi Prant and extend Dipawali greetings to them. This was intended to imbibe a sense of Sewa among the Swayamsevaks. 59,468 families from 958 Bastis were contacted and calendars and lamps were gifted to them. During this Abhiyan, 10,617 men & women visited Seva-Bastis forming 2,352 teams. This included 643 girl students & women. 270 Student Shakhas and 824 Vyavasayi Shakhas participated.

### **Jammu & Kashmir**

1) Online Shivir of about 200 college student chiefs was held on 16 & 17 April 2020.

In the month of June, Bal Shibir was held in 5 districts. 1198 Bal Swayamsevaks participated.

2) During the visit of Ma. Sarkaryavah ji from 11 to 14 January 2021, meetings with Prant Karyakarini, Gatividhi Pramukhs were held and small meetings were held in Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh divisions separately.

### **Dakshin Bihar**

For overall development of Yuva Karyakartas a two day online camp was arranged on 30, 31 May 2020. 1,245 Karyakartas participated. They were expected

to follow all camp rules from their own homes. Topics for discussion included 'Personal traits essential for a Social Leader' and a lecture on 'Role of Sangh in present world scenario' was delivered. The program was useful to strengthen the Gat Vyavastha amongst Yuva Karyakartas.

### **Odisha Paschim**

**Achar Vibhag Competition** - An online competition of 'Achar Vibhag' was arranged in the Prant for all Mukhya Shikshaks. Each one was expected to record and upload a Video of 'Achar Vibhag' from his own residence. 180 Mukhya Shikshaks participated. The Mukhya Shikshaks were active due to this event.

### **Dakshin Bang**

2,354 Karyakartas assisted 40,000 families in 1,432 villages affected by the severe cyclone "Amfan" that came on 20 May 2020.

Medical camps were conducted at 100 places and 40 villages were adopted by Samaj Seva Bharati and facilities of housing, temples, education, distribution of coconut and supari seeds and medical facilities were arranged for the people. Swayamsevaks helped in organizing these activities.

All our Karyakartas have made utmost efforts utilising all mediums of contact and conversations to further our work in the most adverse of conditions. They have displayed their imagination and experimental skills. As a consequence our work is returning back to normal. Observing all the rules and regulations laid down by the government, our daily Sangh work is progressing speedily. The usual touring, meetings and workshops are also being conducted. We are confident that we will be able to conduct our Sangh Shiksha Varg this year. Finding ways ahead in adversity is our Sanskar.

## National Scenario

### Construction of a grand temple of Shri Ram on Janmabhoomi

Various hurdles in construction of the much awaited Shri Ram temple at Ayodhya were removed after the favorable judgment given by Supreme Court on 09 November 2019. In the given period of time, the process of setting up a trust for the construction of the temple was completed by the Central Government.

The trust under the chairmanship of Poojaniya Nriya Gopal Das ji, took initiative and by organizing the Bhoomi puojan on 05th August 2020, started the construction of Shri Ram Temple.

The auspicious work was performed by Prime Minister, Hon'ble Narendra Bhai Modi in the holy presence of respected saints, and in august presence of P. P. Sarsanghachalak Ma. Mohan ji Bhagwat, the Honorable Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh Shri Yogi Adityanath ji, Respectable Governor of Uttar Pradesh, Smt. Anandiben Patel, members of the trust. Crores of Shri Ram devotees witnessed the live telecast of this ceremony.

In India and abroad, a feeling of self respect and pleasure was experienced by all devotees of Shri Ram. This ceremony shall be marked in golden letters in this century.

### Mass contact campaign

For the construction of the temple at the call of Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth Kshetra Trust the Trust, Vishwa Hindu Parishad undertook a comprehensive

drive for mass contact and collection of 'Samarpan Nidhi'.

Karyakartas reached villages and homes and collected Samarpan Nidhi. Over last 30 - 35 years, entire society has been associated with the movements for freeing Shri Ram Janmabhoomi. The same reverence was witnessed after a long time once again. Since the beginning, vision of an integral power of the society in this movement has been observed. During the comprehensive contact program, the same 'one nation - one society' was seen. Once again it was experienced that the society can come together and stand as one, overcoming all types of narrow thoughts.

The grand Shri Ram temple and its inspiring campus that is being constructed at Ayodhya is being established as a symbol of an organized power of a Nation. ### Farmers Agitation

The Central Government tabled 3 Acts relating to Agriculture in the Parliament and they were passed by a majority.

In this context, some farmer organizations did not agree and started opposing the action taken by the government through protests. The intensity of the agitation increased with time. Several rounds of talks went on between the government representatives and agitating farmer organizations, but the agitators remained firm on their demand despite the government accepting few proposals to modify the laws.

It is not in anyone's interest for any kind of agitation to be prolonged for a long time. Discussions are a must, but with a view to finding a solution. It is possible that not all issues are agreed upon, but it is essential that some agreements must be reached upon.

It is also a matter of concern that day to day life is affected due to agitations. The problem becomes more serious when anti-national and anti-social forces try to thwart the ongoing efforts towards a solution. The leadership of the present agitation should not allow such a situation to arise.

In the near past, we have felt that such anti-national forces are trying to create an environment of disturbance and instability in the country and to achieve their political ambitions.

We believe that there are no unsolvable problems. What is needed is sincere efforts.

In a democracy, all have the freedom of expressing their views, but none can be given the right to create disturbance and instability in the country.

### Forthcoming Years

During the pandemic, we got the opportunity to reflect on many aspects of life.

For the last one year, we have experienced that a moderate, balanced life can be lived. The problem of pollution had increased due to traffic. In this period, we have experienced the water of rivers becoming pristine and experienced quality air.

Deliberations were also started on the causes of workers migration. Many state governments, social organizations have also started working on this problem after making plans. More intensive efforts are necessary to ensure that skilled people are available locally and workers are not compelled to go far away from their homes.

There is a need to promote decentralized systems and to inspire the younger generation to establish small manufacturing units to fulfill local needs. There would be great importance to the initiatives taken by the Government and that of experienced and knowledgeable people from the industry. In this regard, educational, social institutions as well as service institutions need to determine their role.

Social, cultural and religious programs have restarted smoothly. The government has also set in place an adequate system of vaccination. The intensity of the crisis has also reduced. Following the general rules and directives diligently is in the interest of everyone.

We not only have to normalise our Sangh Karya at a rapid pace but also have to carry on with the various experiments done in the past year. We have had an opportunity to learn many things.

The coming 3-4 years are very important for our work.

Along with the expansion of Shakha work we will have to meet with the challenges in the intellectual realm and effectively implement our efforts.

We are confident that with a team of Karyakartas who have accepted this daily work as penance and have moulded their life accordingly and with increasing level of acceptance of our work in the society we will definitely reach our goal.

## राष्ट्रीय स्वयंसेवक संघ व राष्ट्रीय सेवा भारती. कोरोना सेवा कार्य

Swayamsevaks have worked fearlessly and have done all types of work including cremation of Corona affected dead bodies. An all out effort was made to reach persons with special needs and senior citizens who live alone. Sewa is being carried out continuously till this date.
